






Dear Patti, All those leaves! I hit a great tee shot then couldn't find my ball among the leaves scattered along fairway or piled in the rough. What am I supposed to do if my ball gets lost in the leaves? Signed, hidden in plain sight

Dear hidden in plain sight,

Our course has all those beautiful trees lining the fairways, but a consequence in the fall—those colorful leaves cover the course! If you lose your ball in the leaves, then the local "Leaf Rule" for CVGC applies. During fall months you may drop your ball (where a consensus of your team believes it was lost) without a penalty.

Remember, without the leaf rule in effect our local course rules for O.B. and lost ball are followed. You may choose to play "stroke and distance"; however, intending to keep the pace of play, you have the option of advancing the ball to the expected point of loss or where the ball crossed out of bounds. Relief is taken at the nearest point <u>on the fairway</u> and no closer to the hole for a two-stroke penalty. This would not apply to a ball lost in a Penalty Area.
