I have seen quite a few women post about their scores (which are all acceptable) and their anxiety of playing with others to the point where they prefer to play alone. I used to feel the same and so am sharing what has helped me: ❶ Absolve yourself of the notion that anyone is riveted to your game. They are not. They are focused on themselves. ❷ Keep your own score and let them keep theirs. **[Note: This doesn't apply to our weekly tournament play].** ❸ No one cares how you play, they *ONLY* care about your *PACE OF PLAY*. So establish when you meet them that you like to play ready golf and then *BE* ready. ❹ If you are imploding on a hole, there is no shame in picking up your ball. Remember, no one is enjoying watching you tough it out. **[Follow CVWGC's max stroke formula in our CVWGC Local Course Rules: Par + 2 + POPS then pick up your ball].**



If you keep up your attitude and your pace, no one will ever mind playing with you.

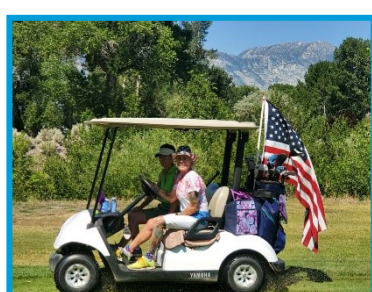

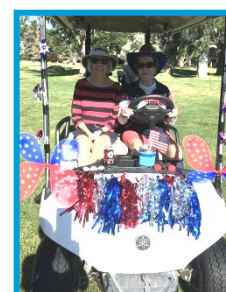

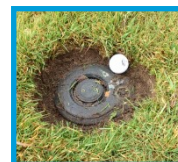

GOLF'S THREE UGLIEST WORDS: "STILL YOUR SHOT." ~DAVE MARR



Dear Patti,
When and how can I take relief without taking a penalty (a.k.a. "free relief")?
Signed, An Outlier

Dear Outlier, according to USGA Rule 16.1b "free relief" is allowed when the ball is in the general area and there is interference by an abnormal course condition such as standing water, embedded ball, cart path or ground under repair. Local course rules further clarify "abnormal" as man-made obstructions like sprinkler heads, control boxes, range markers including large logs placed on the ground adjacent to some of the greens qualify (i.e., Holes #3, #4, #9 and #15). Free relief is also granted **IF** consensus of your team deems your golf club would come into contact with rocks and/or stones. Boundary fences **DO NOT** qualify for free relief on any hole.



Once the area of complete relief is identified, your ball must be dropped within one club-length from the reference point and never closer to the hole.

On Par With Dan



After watching the U.S. Open at Torrey Pines this month and playing in some of our heavy rough, I have been asked for the best technique to use when your ball is buried in the thick stuff. The first thing you have to do is choose a club with enough loft to get the ball out and back to the fairway and leave the hybrids and fairway woods in the bag. Hybrids can be great from medium to light

rough but as it gets deeper a short iron or wedge becomes the best option to cut through the thick blades of grass. The next adjustments that need to be made are to choke down on the club 1"-2", move the ball back in your stance, and swing with more wrists. This creates a chopping action and a steeper angle of attack allowing the club to get underneath the ball. Hopefully this will help the next time you find your ball deep in the rough, but remember the best advice is to not hit it there in the first place.
