Dear Patti Patti Parker's Monthly Rules Advice Column

ear Patti, I was playing with my group of two and we had the same make and color of ball. I hit the ball and it was not mine. What do I do now? It simply looked like my ball.

Signed, Accidents Happen

Dear Accidents Happen,

You are correct accidents do happen. Unfortunately you played the wrong ball. You get a general penalty which is two strokes (yes, that's right a TWO-stroke penalty). Once you have identified that you played the wrong ball, replace both balls to their original place and then play out the hole adding the two-stroke penalty to your score for that hole.

The best way to avoid being accident prone is to always make some kind of identifying mark on your ball in the future. USGA rules allow you pick



up your ball to verify it is your ball. However, there is a protocol to follow covered under USGA Rule 14. Click on this link to watch a short video explaining both Rule 6.3c and Rule 14 for the protocol for picking up your ball to identify it: Rule 6.3c Explained
