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


golfing outfit seems complete without appropriate headwear. and for golf, we know a visor keeps you shaded, looks sharp, and still allows you to rock a pony-

Today's golf club bags are sleeker, lighter, and come with more desirable features than the clunky models of the past. Few modern golf club bags are heavy leather. Instead, most golf club bags are made from strong, lightweight synthetic materials that resist stains, dirt, and moisture. Here are some that are considered "the best".

triking a ball resting on the turf has its challenges and leaves barely any room for error. Having the ball set higher on golf tees makes life a lot easier, especially with your driver. It almost permits you to cheat a little, legitimately, of course. Using the best golf tee will give you an advantage off the tee box. By current estimations, there are 2 billion golf tees used in the U.S. market each season! As per the rules, a golf tee size may not exceed 4 inches in length. Most tees vary in length between 2½ inches and a maximum of 4 inches. The most commonly used length is 2 ¾ inches.



Pride Professional Tee System Plastic Golf Tees. Low-resistance tip for less friction, Comes in plastic or wood. Leading choice on the PGA Tour.

Martini 3-1/4" Step-Up Tees. Good ball support. Bright colors. Consistent height of the tee.

Best Golf Balls for Seniors



egardless of ability or age, playing the best golf balls for your game is important. Thankfully most brands offer different models that have been specifically designed for different types of player, so what are the best golf balls for seniors and what is it about them that makes them a good choice for the older player? Swing speed is a major factor in determining distance, but the ball's design and construction has a bearing too.

Titelist Tour Soft. For those in search of a soft feel golf ball,



this ball delivers an impressively balanced set of performance characteristics, and offers a good feel without compromising consistency or distance in the long game.

Wilson Duo Soft. A ball that performs well and will appeal to

those who prefer a high ball flight and soft feel. Players may feel as though they lose a little touch and spin around the greens versus a premium ball, yet the Duo Soft feels



superb off the face at the top end of the bag.

Callaway Super Soft. This is a fantastic performing ball and



unbelievable value. A definite recommendation if you don't want to spend more money on premium golf balls.

TaylorMade Unisex's Soft Response. In the hands of a mid

or slower swinger, there is plenty of performance to be had here. Specifically, the short game feel and spin control are outstanding for a ball that comes in at less than \$30.00 per dozen.






Dear Patti

Patti Parker's Monthly Rules Advice Column





Great question, Divot Diva, and I'm so glad you want to fix those nasty ball marks on the greens. Fixing a ball mark is very easy to do. According to USGA, the proper way is to insert the ball mark repair tool behind the ball mark and gently push the top of the tool toward the center. Continue working around the ball mark, pushing the surrounding turf in toward the center of the indentation. Avoid using a lifting or twisting motion because this can damage

turf roots. Once you have finished pushing turf in toward the center, gently tamp the area down with your putter to create a smooth, firm surface.
