Patti Parker's Monthly Rules Advice Column



ear Patti.

I hit a good shot that really took "off" and could be either out-of-bounds or even lost. What do I do now?

Signed, Bye-Bye to a Birdie

Dear Bye-Bye,

Both a lost ball and/or a ball hit out-of-bounds [OB] of the general area are treated the same under USGA rule 18.2; Stroke-and-Distance Relief must be taken for one penalty stroke.

A ball is OB when all of the ball lies outside the boundary edge of the general area (see diagram).

A ball that is declared OB is considered out of play and may **NOT** be played even if found. However, a player may stand out of bounds in order to play a ball that lies within bounds.

If you are not sure if your ball is lost or OB then you may announce and hit a "provisional" ball in order to save the time of returning to either the tee box or to the location where the errant stroke was first taken. The

President's Cup—August 8th & 15th

The Club's annual President's Cup tournament is held on both August 8th and 15th. Here are the things you need to know:

- If you can only play in one round, you can still be eligible to win, but you must **<u>pay</u>** <u>for both rounds</u>, and your total score will be based on only one round.
- You must be a member in good standing for the last two months, and you must have played at least five games with the women's club.
- The overall winner is based on gross score. Overall low gross winner is ineligible for flight placing. Flight winners are based on low net scores.
- Even if you don't want to participate in the President's Cup competition, you can still play golf that day!
