## **Dear Patti** Patti Parker's Monthly Rules Advice Column

ear Patti,

Last month I asked about a shot that

was thought to be out of bounds. You responded that besides "Stroke and Distance" a Ladies Club Local Rule and Pace of Play option

for a two-stroke penalty would be to advance the ball to the fairway where the ball crossed out-of-bounds. What happens when you are OB around the green where there is no closer fairway?

Once again, Bye-Bye to a Birdie

Dear Bye-Bye to a Birdie,

USGA Rule 18.2 allows "Stroke & Distance" for OB and lost balls in the **general area**. Our local Pace-of-Play rule [for a 2 stroke penalty] might save you time from returning to where

the errant stroke was first taken; however, there may be no fairway any closer. A couple of examples I can think of is hitting it beyond the river and the green on #2 or over the logs on green #3 then moving it to the closest fairway would mean moving it back to where the fairway ends in front of the green. A better option available is to call a "provisional" shot for Stroke and Distance. If you then confirm your ball is lost or OB you must play your provisional shot for one-stroke and distance penalty.

Remember, though, it is not a choice to take your provisional shot instead of your original ball <u>IF</u> found in-bounds or in the general area. If your ball is found to be inside a penalty zone, then the relief options for that penalty zone apply. You may never play a ball from out-of-bounds even if you think it is playable since an OB ball is no longer in play.

## **Gunsan Country Club**

The longest hole in golf is this Par 7 at Gunsan Country Club in South Korea. It is 1,097 yards long. Think about this. There are 1,760 yards in a mile, so this hole is 663

yards short of being one mile long! How would you like to play that one? Of course, if you play from the red tees, it is only 932 yards long! Easy-peasy!
