Tournament Scheduling Guidelines

General Meetings

General Meetings (GM) are held on the 1st Tuesday of each month, therefore to accommodate our "out of town" members, the game on a GM Day must be a format facilitating quick play (i.e., Scramble format, etc.).

Course Aeration Considerations

Each year the course performs necessary aeration maintenance which includes spiking and sanding of the greens. This process affects play for a period of time in the following manner;

- 1. It restricts the use of the entire course front and back nine holes will be closed to play in successive weeks requiring playing the same nine holes twice for an eighteen (18) hole round.
- 2. Impairs putting aeration holes cause uneven putting surface with sanding impairing the speed and roll of the ball.

To address these adverse and unfair conditions the Tournament Chair will meet with the course grounds crew to ascertain the following;

- 1. When the aeration maintenance is scheduled to occur.
- 2. When and for how long each section (front and back nine) will be closed to play.
- 3. Approximately how long the greens will be affected after the aeration process occurs.

Once the above information has been ascertained the following adjustments can be made to the Tournament scheduling process;

- 1. If either the front or back nine are closed due to aeration, a 9-hole eclectic may be scheduled on the "open" 9-holes.
- 2. Avoid any Count Your Putt games if greens will be in sub-par condition due to aeration and sanding.
- 3. Non-postable games should be scheduled during the time the greens are affected by the aeration process.
- 4. Regardless of the type of game scheduled;
 - a. Putts will be capped at 2 per hole.
 - b. If a postable game is scheduled it will be up to the board if scores should be posted.

HSTP Qualifying Rounds

- 1. Must be a postable round.
- 2. Recommended to be held on the last Tuesday of the month or 3 weeks prior to the actual HSTP tournament:
 - Week 1 Allow remainder of qualifying week for;
 - \circ $\,$ Play qualifying round.
 - Scoring round and determine qualifiers, rankings, pairings, etc.
 - Initiate notification of qualifiers and alternates.
 - Week 2 Allow the 2nd week for;
 - Confirmation of Team and Alternates.
 - Register or notify NNGA of CVWGC team 7 days before Tournament.
 - Replace registered players, who must drop out, with alternates as needed.
 - Week 3 Adjustments to the Team are allowed until the day before the Tournament

Presidents Cup and Club Championship

- 1. Presidents Cup should be held in August.
- 2. Presidents Cup will be a stroke play eclectic game.
- 3. Club Championship should be held in September.
- 4. Club Championship will be a stroke play game.
- 5. Each will be played on two consecutive days or weeks.

Closing Luncheon

The Closing Luncheon (CL) is normally held on the second or third Tuesday of October season and like the GM days the game of the day must be a format facilitating fast play (i.e., Scramble format, etc.)

Tee Time

The Tee Time during the season will be adjusted due to climate and daylight as follows;

| Month | Time | Reason |
|--------------------|---------|------------------|
| April | 9:30 am | Cold & frost |
| May — July | 8:30 am | Normal |
| August - September | 8:00 am | Heat |
| October | 9:00 am | Darkness & frost |

Rounds

Ladies' Day play will commence on the first Tuesday of April.

- 1. There shall be no fewer than 27 nor more than 31 rounds of play ending no later than the last Tuesday of October.
- 2. Schedule should consist of a minimum of 20 postable rounds.
- 3. The schedule should include two (2) team payout opportunities each month **Note :**

A postable game may include a team component.
